Interests: Since her post-doctoral project on the taboo topic of Istrian exodus her main research area is anthropology of memory, population transfers, besides topics of intangible heritage, beliefs, interdisciplinarity.

Her recent book *In the silence of memory. "Exodus" and Istria* (in Slovenian) received a big echo in wider public and received several awards. It was published by an internationally renowned publisher Berghahn books, Oxford, New York in English. In process is the publication in Italian by BEE.

Her successful scientific activity is evident in the fact that she is currently leading two research projects and a programme: Ethnography of Silences (2023-26) financed by the Slovenian National Agency of Research and Innovation and RE4Healing: Crossborder Remembrance, Reconnection, Restoring, and Resilience (CERV-2024-CITIZENS-REM-HOLOCAUST); programme Heritage as an Object and Reflection of Social Processes (ARIS P6-0460, 1/1/2025 - 12/31/2027); The fact that she is successfully transferring the results of her scientific activity to the wider public is evidenced by the highly successful and award-winning project Mythical Park (INTERREG V-A: Slovenia - Croatia), which was developed on her initiative and based on her research on the mythical landscape in Rodik.
